3.08 Acrylic Painting: Alla Prima (*All at Once*)

If you already have supplies, you can substitute what you have to start off. We will discuss more about supplies the first class. Depending on what you want to do with the paint, where you shop, what they stock (brush brands, brands of canvas) can vary, so I suggest shopping at Jerry's Artarama for now. This list will get you started, and you can add to it as you learn what you want to do. Save your receipts, just in case you want to exchange something.

Materials List

Paint: Golden Heavy Body Acrylics

(2 oz. tubes or 4 oz. jars. The bigger quantity you buy, the less expensive per ounce. Also, it is easier to put paint back in jars---so if you're in this for a while, go with the jars). Recommended below are a "warm" and "cool" of each of the Primary Colors (Yellow, Blue & Red) along with Titanium White and Payne's Gray.

With the colors below, you'll gain valuable experience in mixing/matching colors to meet nearly every need:

- Lemon Yellow
- Cadmium Yellow
- Ultramarine Blue
- Cobalt Blue
- Alizarin Red
- Cadmium Red (Medium)
- Titanium White
- Payne's Gray

Brushes:

- #4 & #6 round, & #6 & 8 Flat (1 each)

Other Materials

- 1 Multi-Media Pad 14 x 17" or 18x24"
(Paper in this pad should be rated a minimum of 100lb weight, which would be okay for use with water media paint, such as acrylic or watercolor.)

- Recommend 3 or 4 sticks of Willow Charcoal for drawing
- Disposable Palette Pad 12" x 16"
- Plastic Mixing Tray that will hold your colors and provide some extra partitions for mixing colors.
